10 ways to raise \$25

Raising money to help another person can be lots of fun. It also helps other people to learn about the cause you are raising money for!

Fundraising is an activity you can do alone or with friends and family or at school.

This winter Kids Giving Back is running an online fundraising campaign to ensure hundreds of homeless people receive super warm 100% merino wool beanies and hand warmers.

Through raising funds to purchase these items you will be helping people who are homeless, Kids Giving Back, the farmers and businesses who are supplying the winter woollies!!

Your parents or teachers are great people to work with on a fundraising project.

Before you start your fundraising, talk to them about your ideas and how you are going to do it.

Every fundraising project needs to have a "Risk Assessment". Why not give a responsible adult the job of being the "Risk Assessor" for you? With an adult's permission, you can get on with reaching the goals of your fundraising project!

The next generation of generosity

If you are looking for ways to raise money we found **10 IDEAS** that might work for you...

- 1 Hold a cake or drink stall - chocolate crackles and cupcakes are always popular. 
- 2 Ask 10 friends and family to each sponsor you \$2.50 to undertake an activity, like running 25 laps of the oval or reading 25 books!
- 3 Collect cans, bottles and containers... around 250 of them! Log on to returnandearn.org.au 
- 4 Request donations instead of presents for your next birthday!
- 5 Save your pocket money and put aside a little each week or ask for a loan from a parent and pay it back from your pocket money. 
- 6 Organise your class for a team fundraising effort and ask every classmate to bring in a gold coin. Your class will have helped made someone warm this winter!
- 7 Arrange a Garage Sale with your family and clear out your unwanted household items. 
- 8 Collect old wire and metal and sell it for scrap metal. Check out www.scrapmetal.com.au
- 9 Start a small social enterprise making bookmarks, greeting cards or friendship bands and sell to friends, family and school mates... let them know that their purchase will make a difference to someone's life. 
- 10 Sometimes it is not about directly raising money but spreading the word amongst friends and family about the charity you are raising money for, so why not do a presentation at school, or inform your family and friends about our Warm4Winter fundraising? Ask people if they will donate to the campaign or share the message on their social media. That way you may raise more than \$25. If 10 people participate because of your encouragement then you have raised \$250 !
